"Unto dust thou shalt return" don't place your bets on sure losers; God is the only sure winner.

During this Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday, let's follow the Divine Master as we have never before followed Him. Let's not play up to the Joneses, or follow the bad example of others, but rather let's answer Christ's wall of:"Come follow Me".

Sooner than we think each one of us is going to be before the judgment chair of God, and, brothers, on that day bowling averages won't mean a thing, neither will a fat bank roll, or membership cards to exclusive clubs; only one thing will count - have you followed Christ or not.

Let's be sure to follow the Laws of Abstinence and Fasting. It may be a little tough giving up that porkchop or hamburger, but think of Christ who gladly gave His life for YOU. He gave His life for you; what will you give?

FELLOWS, MEET FRANCIS SWINARSKY:

It was on Sept. 10th, 1917 in the Marion Section; of Jersey City, that a bouncing baby boy was born to Mr. & Mrs. Martin Swinarsky (Anna Nowicki). Thru sacrifice we prove the love that we proclaim up to that point only with our tongues. A girl is never satisfied with the simple "I love you" but wants that love proved by the way the boy treats her and her family. We prove our love by our actions. That is why Christ died on the 1.17 Cross, because He wanted to give the the best proof of His love for tus. The Bible says:"Greater love than this no man hath, than to lay down his life for his friends" .- Thru -His passion and death, Christ proved to us His love.

Since Christ dicd on Friday, try to show our love for Him in a special way, especially on that day. The Church has shown us their way to prove that love, mamely by abstaining from the eating of meat on that day. So, on a Friday, a Catholic can say to God: "Dear God, I love you very much for all You have done for me. I also love meat an awful lot, too, and so to prove my love for You today, Friday, I am going to make a sacrifice - I'm going to give up the pleasure of cating meat, so that I can have the pleasure of proving my love for You".

The Church has placed this abobligation of proving our love for God from time to time.
