The month of November, as you boys and inlamination is the month of the Poor Souls in Purgatory. During this month cach one of us should especially remember to pray for all the people who are suffering for their sins in the place we call purgatory.

As you know from your Catechism, those people who die without a single sin on their souls go immediately to heaven, where they will be happy with God forever and ever. Those people who die with mortal sin, or big sin, on their soul go immediately to hell, where they will suffer for ever and ever for their sins.

But what about those people who die with small sins on their souls, or those people who during their life did not make up for all the sins they had committed while they were yet alive? What happens to those people.

Well, they can't go to heaven, because they are not clean enough in their souls. They can't be sent to hell, because they have already confessed their big sins and now only have small sins on their souls Cortainly God would not punish them with hell if they don't deserve it.

Well, what does happen to them?
In that case, God sends them to
a place called purgatory, where
they suffer until God feels that
they have made up for all their
sins and that they have been
punished long enough. Then, they
are permitted to go to heaven.

So you see we do not have to help those people who are in heaven, because they do not need our help. We cannot help those people who are in hell, because they will stay there forever and ever. But the poor souls in purgatory not only can be helped by us, but must be helped by us.

Everyone of us has someone who may be in purgatory, and it is the duty of each one of us to pray for them. They are like people who are drowning and don't know how to swim. We thru our

Masses and prayers, throw them a spiritual life-saver and so help save their souls for ever.

How would you like it if you were down at the seashore and all of a sudden began to drown. Suppose you began to yell for help, and although the people, even your own family, saw you drowning, did nothing at all to help you or try to save you? You wouldn't think much of them, would you?

Then, how do you suppose those poor people in purgatory feel, when we don't pay a bit of attention to their cries for help? We have many friends who have died. We have relatives who have died. But how many times have we prayed for them since their funeral? How many times have we gone to visit their graves in the Cemetery? How many times, have we had Masses said for them.

The next time you spend time watching TV or the movies, think of how much better it would have been to spend part of that time in Church or at their grave, praying for them. The next time you go for a car ride or go to visit some friend or relative, think of how much good you could have done for some poor soul in purgatory.

Besides this, we must never forget that none of us, not one single one of us, knows when we ourselves are going to die. Recently when I was in the hospital two people died - one, was a man 64 years old; the other was a boy who was only seven years old. And so you see, we never know when our turn will come.

When some poople die, it will be a very sad day. When they will come before the judgment chair of God, they will see souls who will say: "You had time for everything else, but no time to pray for me." Will you be one of them, or will you be one who will meet many happy faces, who will thank you for your kind remembrance? That depends on no one, but YOU!
