On June 27, 1940, Frank finally worked up enough courage to say "I will" to Olga Tal here at St. Stephen's, where they were married with the beautiful solemnity of a Nuptial Mass. Recently they, (which includes their son, Edward Francis) moved to their new home at 92 Valley Road, Clifton.

While at school, Frank was quite the athlete, taking active participation in soccer, baseball, and basketball. Later, both in Bridgeport and Passaic, he played semi-pro baseball and football.

Frank has always been active in Church circles, both here and in his hometown. There, as here, he was active in the Holy Name. Many will remember his great work with the old Kenyons and the now-defunct St. Stephen's A.C. He is still one of our active collectors at Church.

He loves deep-sea fishing and cabinet work, but still manages to be an active member of our bowling league, where last year he courted a 160 average.

While Frank is not old from the view point of years, he is old in experience. His assistance in running affairs is priceless. We can always count on Frank to give good, sound advice from past experience. We consider it a definite privilege to number mild-mannered Frank among our brother members.

## THE KIDDY CORNER

This month, boys and girls, we are going to ask you for a favor - a real big favor, so pay close attention now. Once there was a man who never went to Church, never went to Communion, and never ever prayed. One day he met a good old Catholic man, and they began to talk about God and religion. The first man was bitter and said: "Why should I go to Church? Why should I go to Holy Communion? And why should I pray? What has God ever done for me?"

The second man quietly pulled out his Rosary beads, took the Cross in his hand and showed him the image of Jesus nailed to the Cross. Then he said: "That's what God did for you, but what have you done for Him?"

Now, boys and girls, very soon we shall celebrate Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. During this time we are not only supposed to give up things like movies, candy, and cake, but we are supposed to show God how much we really love Him.

If we do not do anything special during Lent, that means only one thing, no matter what we say, it only proves that we do not really love God.

Now, what can we do for Jesus during Lent? Oh, there are millions of things we can do, but I think that the best thing we can do is to bring the people in our own family closer to God. Just stop and try to remember when was the last time you saw your Father or Mother, brother or sister, go to Communion or even to Mass. Maybe it was a long, long time ago. Well, isn't it time then that we try to get them to go now, especially during Lent?

Many times we even get them angry when we try to get them to go to Church. They will send you but they themselves will not go. They will tell you that they love God, but are too tired or too busy. Just tell them that Jesus wasn't too tired or too busy to die for us. Just show them the Cross on your Rosary and tell them: "This

is what Jesus did for you; and what have you done for Jesus?"

If they tell you that you do not have to do all these things to prove your love, then try this on them. For a couple of days, don't kiss them, and speak to them only if you have to. Don't hug them, even. Pretty soon, they will notice this and will ask you: "Why don't you hug me and kiss me any more? Why don't you talk to me? Don't you love me anymore?" Then you can tell them that you do love them very much but you do not think it is necessary to do these things to prove your love.

If they tell you that it is important to show your love, then tell them it is just as important to show our love for God by doing the things God wants us to do. Yes, many times we are busy, but that is why God gave us 365 days in a year, so that we will have enough time for everything. Just tell them that if Jesus could hang on the Cross for three hours, the least we can do is sit for one hour in Church on Sunday.

Remind them that one mortal sin is enough to send a soul into hell forever. Wouldn't it be horrible if one of your family would not get to heaven like the rest? Just ask them to think about that! Tell them, that if they really love you tell will think about this; they will want to go to Mass and Communion, because they want everyone in the family to be together some day in heaven.

So now, during Lent, get after them and don't let them give you any funny answers. Tell them you don't want to get them angry; you only want them to do what God wants so that all of you can meet in heaven. I know of one father who hit his son, when he tried to get him to go to Church. If that should happen, just say, good and loud: "Jesus, you suffered for me, now I will suffer for you." But above all let us all pray for them together, so that they will see how much they got from God, and how little they have given to Him.
