ARE YOU ASHAMED OF OUR LADY?

It certainly is an odd man or woman who is ashamed to profess his love in public. Did you ever think of how proud you were when you walked up the street towards the girl friend's house with a box of candy tucked under your arm? You weren't ashamed, were you? You weren't even ashamed to admit to the whole world that this was YOUR girl; why you would ever kiss her in public. And why not, you loved her, after all!

Were you ever ashamed to kiss or embrace your Father or Mother even though a lot of people were watching you? Of course not! Were you ever ashamed to loudly boast that you knew Mr. Bigshot in town or that you were a Yankee fan, or that you once got a good score in bowling? Never!

No, we are never ashamed to profess our love publicly except when it comes to religion. We are children of the Blessed Mother and should always be ready to declare our love for her. Yet, just stop to think. Do you wear her medal or scapular around your neck? Do you say the Rosary in her honor daily? Or, don't you even carry her Rose in your pocket or handbag? If you answer is "No" to those questions then there is only one possible explanation; no matter what you say, you do not love Mary or else you would never be ashamed to show your love for her anywhere, anytime, and before anyone.

May is the month of Mary. During this month we should show her our love in a special way. You have your daily Rosary, your Wed. night Novenas, your Communions. Are you ashamed of her? - even among your fellow Catholics in Church? Well, don't be! You can be truly proud of her. Otherwise, the day will come in the not too distant future, when she may be ashamed of you. Be with her this month, and often so you can be with her forever!

This was all due to the fact that John loved school, for after work he attended Fordham University, winding up with a B.S. degree in accounting. Not satisfied with this, he is now going to NYU working for a M.B.A. in business management.

All this was interrupted for over three years, during which time John was in the Navy. Our Parish entered into the picture, when on July 9, 1949, John wed Edna Phillips in our Church. Since then they have added a 3rd member to the family, Patrick, who keeps them more than busy at their home at 365 Main Ave., in Passaic.

Between work and school, John doesn't have much free time, even though he professes his love for baseball. He does belong to a few clubs besides the Holy Name:- he is Veep of both the Key Club and the Mid-Century Gun Club, as well as a member of the Fordham Alumni Association. The combination of old coin collecting and pistol shooting also strike his fancy.

In the relatively short time John has been with us, he has won our friendship and admiration. His zeal and thoroughness is a model to all. It is with the greatest of pleasure that we declare our joy in knowing this Hungarian Irishman.

He will hold his lecture on Wed., May 21st at 8:30 P.M. All males over 18 are invited. No charge, of course! Take advantage of this opportunity to learn the right information on Birth Control.

Hats off to Frank Zurey and Steve Weninger for masterminding the Easter Dance for the Holy Name. It was by far the most successful venture of the Holy Name. Thanks to the wonderful cooperation of the members of the Holy Name and our Parishioners, we entertained over 500 people. Plans are being made to get the same orchestra for a dance in the Fall. Watch for notices to that effect.

This year for the first time, our Diocese will hold "The Living Rosary" at the Eastside High School Stadium on May 12th. Listen in the Church for further details, and keep your eyes open for particulars in the local newspapers. It is not unusual for 50,000 or more people to take part in these services in other dioceses. We urgently ask all our Parishioners to join the other Catholics of the Diocese on that day in paying tribute to the Mother of God.

During May we shall have our own services in honor of the Blessed Mother; every Wed. at 7, Hungarian Novena, at 7:30 in English; Rosary on Friday and Saturday nights at 7:30. Every Wed. throughout the year the 7 A.M. Mass is offered for the Novena intentions placed in the Novena box, by the Blessed Mother's altar. The Mass is the highest form of worship we have. If you have never done so, fill out a card to be found there, and drop it in the box. Mary will see to it that your prayer be heard.

On May 18th at 3 P.M. we shall hold the annual services of the Coronation of the Blessed Mother. Each year more and more people come to witness this wonderful spectacle of tribute to Mary. Set that date aside, join us, and you won't forget it - neither will Mary forget you!

The PTA sponsored Card Party that was held last Sunday was a huge success. Our thanks for the hard working Committee, and to all who came, and thus contributed to the success. There were many new faces which meant that a lot of the support came from people outside the Parish. Since it rained that day, and most of us couldn't do much else we could just as easily have come to the Card Party and added to its success. It is your school whether or not you have children attending it; therefore it is also your obligation of supporting it.

This year our Parish will celebrate its 50th Anniversary. As is befitting the occasion a concerted effort will be made to really turn 1952 into a memorable year. THE KIDDY CORNER

There is nobody in this whole wide world who likes a bad boy or a bad girl. We all try to stay away from them. We just don't like them. But there are many different kinds of bad boys and girls in this world. You know many bad children and so do I. But the worst boy and girl is the one who does not love his father and his mother. They are just good for nothing. Sometimes, I think even the devil doesn't like that kind of boy or girl.

On May 11th we shall have Mother's Day, and that will be a big day for all of us. For some of us it will be a very happy day; we will kiss and hug our Mother and tell her how much we love her. Maybe; if we have saved up enough money, we may even give her a present. But there will also be some boys and girls who will be very sad on that day, because they do not have any Mother any more.

This is something we must remember not only on Mother's Day but every day, and that way we will thank God each day that we have a Mother.

In the beginning we talked about bad boys and girls, and we said that the worst boys and girls are those who do not love their Father and Mother. Of course, if you ask any boy or girl if they love their Father and Mother, they will always say that they do. But we must remember that the only way we show that we love them is not by saying it, but doing it.

Maybe a boy says he loves his father, but if he will not do what his father asks him, then he doesn't really love his father. If a girl says that she loves her mother, but will not do what her mother asks her, then she does not really love her mother.

Suppose your father said that he loves you, but doesn't buy you any clothes or doesn't give you any money so that you could buy things you need for yourself, then you would say that your father doesn't really love you. If your

mother never gave you anything to eat and never let you do anything at all that you liked, then you would say that your mother doesn't love you.

On Mother's Day especially you must remember all that your Mother has done for you. Just think of all the things that you have that your Mother gave you. You can really say that everything that you have you got from her. And how do you thank your Mother for all these things, by being bad and never listening to your Mother or by doing what she asks you to do.

Just remember that someday God may take your Mother away into heaven and then you won't have a Mother at all. Would you like that to happen? Sometimes God punishes bad boys and bad girls by taking their Mother away from them. It will be too late then to say how much you love your mother. Now is the time to show her how much you love her.

But don't be like a lot of boys and girls who only show their love on Mother's Day. Every day should be Mother's Day for you. Every time you obey your Mother you are really saying: "Thank you, Mother for everything you have done for me. I love you and want to show you how much I love you by doing anything you ask me to." That way your Mother will love you more and will do even more for you.

We said before that nobody likes a bad boy or a bad girl. If you are bad, no one will like you either. Your Mother and Father will not like you, God will not like you, and you will not even like yourself. You wouldn't want that to happen, would you?

So get into the habit of thanking God each day that He gave you such a wonderful Mother. God wants you to do this and if you do then God will bless you because someday you and your Mother together with God and His Mother will be together forever in heaven. This is something to think about on Mother's Day and every day.
