On June 11, 1922 in the fair city of Passaic, Sir Stork made the last of three visits to Frank Cerny and Mary Herman. As the Baptismal Water was being poured on the new arrival, he was given the name Anthony. At the usual age, little Anthony was taken to School #10 for his first taste of education. After the family moved to Garfield, Tony enrolled and graduated at School #6 in Garfield. Four years later, Tony got his High School diploma in the same city.

Being an enterprising young man, he worked at a Self-Service Store for about two years, following which he joined the Coast Guards, spending most of his time tanning himself in the Caribbean. In the interim, Tony put a ring on the proper finger of Rosemarie Lichtenberger, here at St. Stephen's. Since that day on April 23, 1944, the two have been blessed with the arrival of Brenda, 4½, and Ronald, 6 months. At present they all reside at 396 Allwood Road in Clifton.

After leaving the service, Tony tried the real-estate business in Florida, while going to a TV School at the same time. Four years later he came back to Jersey and worked for Advance Television for almost two years, at which time he went to Federal Telecommunication Laboratory, his present place of employment.

We asked Tony what his hobby was, and his answer was "tinkering". After working hours are over, "Chuck", as he is called by the wife, usually busies himself with TV repair work. Besides being a very active member of the Holy Name Society, Tony is a Collector at Church and a Committeeman for Advancement in our own Scout troop.

School closed last month and already how many boys and girls just your age have died in auto accidents or have drowned. I wonder how many of them died in the state of mortal sin. Everyday you pick up the newspaper and read about someone else who died, maybe someone you knew. Look how many have died during the July 4th holidays.

As we know from our religion, if anyone should die with even only one mortal sin on his soul, that person goes straight to hell. He has made a big sin against God and that is the punishment for all those who die as enemies of God.

Just suppose a girl were to eat a hot-dog when she knew it was Friday. Suppose she were to be on her way home a few days later before she had time to go to Confession. Suppose their car got into an accident and she were to die. You know and I know that she would go straight to hell.

Suppose some boy on vacation were to miss Mass on Sunday just because he was too lazy to go to Church. Suppose that same afternoon, he went in for a swim, and before he could even say an Act of Contrition, he were to drown. You know and I know that that boy would go straight to hell.

Now, boys and girls, nobody knows when they are going to die. You may be that girl or that boy. Of course if you should die with that mortal sin on your soul then you would be the one to go to hell. But the good boys and girls will always keep the laws of God

and the Church, so that if anything should happen to them, they would not be afraid to die. Nobody wants or likes to die, but we know that each of us must die sometime. But the good boy and good girl will never be afraid of death, because they know that if they should die anywhere, they would go straight to heaven.

Sometimes boys and girls think that it is alright to commit sin during vacation because they can go to Confession when they come home. But can you tell me when and how you will die? Of course you can't! That is exactly why you and I must always be sure never to commit sin.

God tells us that death comes like a thief in the night. You know that if a man is going to rob a house he never tells the people that he is going to rob their house. So it is with death. The angel of death never lets us know ahead of time just when we are going to die.

Only the foolish boy or girl commits a sin with the idea that they will go to confession later. So don't be foolish, but wise. It will be too late when you are dead. Let other boys and girls do what they want, but whatever you do, do not ever commit any sin, anytime, anywhere.

If you keep the laws of God, He will really bless you all thru the summer, so that when the vacation is over and you come back to school again, you will tell all your friends what a wonderful time you really had.

But besides all this, remember your Confession and Communion. Do not forget to go regularly so that you can keep coming closer and closer to your God. The careless boy and girl forgets about God, but they forget that then God will forget about them. Show God that you have not forgotten Him even during your vacation, and He will show you how much He loves you and how He remembers you.
