Since it is a religious observance, ceremonies will begin with the singing of a Solemn High Mass at 11 o'clock at which Father John Gaspar, Pastor will be the Celebrant. Rev. Andrew Molnar will be the Sub-deacon, while the Monsignor Joseph Kozi-Horvath will be the Deacon and preacher.

A community dinner will be prepared by the Ladies' Club at noon. There will be the usual sale of religious articles and souvenir gingerbreads, as well as the custimary food and refreshments. Booths will be erected for the entertainment of the guests. We shall also have our regular bowling tournament with handsome prizes. Dancing will commence at 4 P.M.

The main feature of the evening will be the drawing of the raffle winners. This will take place at O P.M. We respectfully request that you return your books as soon as possible. In the spirit of helping your own Parish, please try to sell as many books as possible. Every book helps!

IS CHRIST WEEPING OVER YOU?

' In the Gospel of last Sunday, we heard about a very touching scene in the life of Christ. As He looked down upon the city of Jerusalen, the thought of the indifferentism of his own people nade Hin weep. It reminds one of a mother crying over the plight of a wayward child, and perhaps, if you have experienced this, you can begin to understand the feelings of Christ.

This gospel picture should be one frequently to be used by each of us in our meditations. In this high-geared existence of ours, how often do we, so to speak, put God and the salvation of our soul in the background, and make trivial things so all important.

Why is it that each of us full well knows that at the day of our judgment, only one thing will be important. Nothing else, absolutely nothing else, will matter. And despite this knowledge we live in a manner that belies this truth.

Yes, we night well ask ourselves a few questions. "Have I been making other things more inportant than the salvation of my soul? Have I been neglecting my God? Have I been indifferent towards frequent Confession and Connunion? In other words, have I, or an I giving cause for Christ to weep over me?"

Just stop to think of how much emphasis we place on the material aspects of life, even though we know that we cannot take anything except our soul into the next world. Compare the hours you give your body with the seconds you give your soul, and then you'll be able to see that Christ wasn't merely weeping for the inhabitants of Jerusalen. He may have been weeping for you. But you can change all that now, and do it now and not tonorrow. The time to mend your indifferentism is NOW. Tomorrow may be too late!

ST. STEPHEN'S DAY IN NEW YORK

On Sunday, Aug 24th, Cardinal Spellman will preside at Vesper services at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York, in observance of the Feast of St. Stephen. Bishop Fulton J. Sheen will be the preacher. Ceremonies will begin at 4 P.M. Reservations for bus transportation must be in as soon as possible.

After the services, our Drum and Bugle Corps will lead the parade to Carnegie Hall, where the principal speaker will be Senator Lehman of New York. All Parishes of Hungarian extraction will be represented.

The purpose of the observance is to remember the Feastday itself and also to protest to the continued imprisonment of Cardinal Mindszenty and the other members of the hierarchy in Hungary. It should go without saying, that <u>every</u> member of our Parish should be there.

THE ALTAR SOCIETY is for the Hungarian speaking women who dedicate themselves for the care of the Church itself. They contribute towards the purchasing of the various needs of the Church.

THE ROSARY SOCIETY is for the Hungarian women of the Parish who have a special devotion, to the Rosary of our Blessed Lady.

THE ST. CECILIA'S CHOIR is for the girls of the Parish who use their God-given talent of good voice for worshipping God in song.
