A MEMORANDUM TO ALL PARENTS

When God blessed you with a child, He put a tremendous trust into your hands. He gave you a product of His creation - not just another product, but one made after His own image and likeness. We often read about delinquent parents who abuse this gift by wretchedly failing to give the body and the mind of the child all the care and attention that it requires. But before we begin to condemn such parents, let's examine ourselves to see whether or not we are guilty of a more heinous crime, that of neglecting the soul of the child we claim to love so much. It is as simple as this:- If you really love your child, you will want what is best for him. The best thing for him is a good Catholic school training. If you really love your child as you claim you do, your child would be enrolled right here in St. Stephen's School and NOWHERE else!

Yes, this means sacrifice in some cases, but love, real love that is, knows no sacrifice too great. You might save shoe leather or bus fare, but you might be losing a soul. If Christ thought so much of the soul of your child that He was willing to die for it, what sacrifice is there that you could make that would even begin to compare with His sacrifice? The best that a non-Catholic school has to offer is a good education. The Catholic school gives you that plus a good child, a good citizen, and a future inhabitant of heaven. There is no room for discussion. It should be an obvious conclusion for you to send your child here.

FELLOWS, MEET FRANK WURST!

After completing his grammar school training at Holy Trinity, Frank joined the ranks of the bread-winners at Forstmann and after three years switched to the Botany where he worked for the same length of time. Following this, he went to work for the N.Y. Sash & Door Co.

With twenty years' experience under his belt, he decided to go into business for himself. So, in 1946, he became a partner in the Madison Lumber & Millwork Co.

Previous to this on April 12th 1939 he crossed the threshold of Matrimony with Agnes Tal here at this Parish, and established their home at its present place at 93 Louise St., in Clifton.

When Frank was asked about his hobbies, he replied that he was too busy to have any. Those of us who know him, realize that Frank is indeed a conscientious lad. If he is not working at the Lumber Yard, he is usually working around the house.

He did find time to join the Holy Name, and even though he does not show up for meetings with too much regularity, he does pop in on a meeting or two when he can make time. He is also a member of the German-Hungarian Sick and Death Benefit as well as the Passaic Turn Verein.

Frank is very much on the quiet side which belies his earnestness and enthusiasm. Many of the members of the Holy Name unfortunately have not been able to really know Frank, who in addition to being a zealous worker, has quite a sense of humor. Our only wish is that Frank could be with us more often, so that we could all come to know Frank for the wonderful fellow he is.
