#### A MEMORANDUM TO ALL PARENTS

If you really love your child as you clain you do, your child would be enrolled right here in St. Stephen'S School and NOWHERE else!

If Christ thought so much of the soul of your child that He was willin; to die for it. what sacrifice is there that you could make that would even begin to compare with His sacrifice? After completing his granmar school training at Holy Trinity, Frank joined the ranks of the bread-winners at Forstmann and after three years switched to the Botany where he worked for the same length of time. Following this, he went to work for the N.Y. Sash & Door Co.

With twenty years' experience under his bolt, he decided to go into business for himself. So, in 1946, he became a partner in the Madison Lumber & Millwork Co.

Previous to this on April 12th 1939 he crossed the threshhold of Matrimony with Agnes Tal here at this Parish, and established their home at its present place at 93 Louise St., in Clifton.

When Frank was asked about his hobbies, he replied that he was too busy to have any. Those of us who know him, realize that Frank is indeed a conscientious lad. If he is not working at the Lumber Yard, he is usually working around the house.

He did find time to join the Holy Name, and even though he does not show up for meetings with too much regularity, he does pop in on a meeting or two when he can make time. He is also a member of the German-Hungarian Sick and Death Benefit as well as the Passaic Turn Verein.

Frank is very much on the quiet side which belies his earnestness and enthusiasm. Many of the members of the Holy Name unfortunately have not been able to really know Frank, who in addition to being a zealous worker, has quite a sense of humor. Our only wish is that Frank could be with us more often, so that we could all come to know Frank for the wonderful fellow he is.
