THE HOLY NAME PARADE AND YOU!

The second Sunday in the month of October is traditionally known as Holy Name Sunday. This year on Sunday, October 12th, we shall again observe this day with our usual Parade. This year because we are celebrating our 50th Anniversary, our Parish will head the Parade.

Aside from being one of the Collectors in the Church, Frank is a member of the Holy Name Society. Currently he is also the President of the St. Stephen's Drum and Bugle Corps. As one who did not forget his Navy days, he is also a member of the Amvets, Post #13.

Frank Jr. is always recognized by his contagious smile. With all his many duties, Frank rarely says "No" when asked to pitch in for work. Yes, it was a happy day, when Brother Frank joined the ranks of the Holy Name Society.

THE KIDDY CORNER

So you see we can make Jesus very happy and at the same time know that Jesus will pay us back. Now what can we do to be nice to the Mother of God? We can do many things, but during this month, the month of the Holy Rosary, the best thing we can do is say the Rosary everyday at least during this month.

But this time we are going to ask you to try something new. Almost everyday you have some of your friends come to your house or else maybe you go to the house of one of your friends. Now what we ask you to do is this. Ask a few of your friends to come to your house at a certain time on a certain day. Then when you are all together, kneel down and say the Rosary. Then when you have finished the Rosary, talk it over with your friends where you will meet the next day.

This way is you can get seven people together, then each day you can go to a different house. We are sure that each one of you has at least six friends who are near you and are Catholics. We are sure, too, that your Father and Mother will be very happy to have you invite your friends to your house. You have them come to your house to play or to watch TV, so why not have them come to your house for something that is really worth while.

Now, if you cannot do this, there is something else that you can do. In almost every home, your family is together in the evening. So why not try to do most of your homework right after school. Then after you have had your supper, help Mother with the dishes so that she can finish real fast. Then get all the members of your family together and say the Rosary.

The whole Rosary only takes about ten minutes and so that will still leave you a lot of time for your homework, TV, or anything else. We know that Daddy and Mother are tired after a hard day's work, but tell them that the Rosary only takes a few minutes and after that they can rest or do whatever else they want to do.

But just stop to think how happy you must make Jesus and His Blessed Mother as they look down from heaven and see you and your family and friends saying the Rosary together. Can't you see how happy you make Them. So, if you have not been saying the Rosary up to now, begin it today.

Even you will feel much happier after you have finished the daily Rosary, but imagine how much Mary, our Blessed Mother, and Jesus, Her Son, will want to do for you just so that they can show you how happy you have made Them.

But even if you cannot get any friends or your family to say the Rosary with you, you can still show your love for the Blessed Mother by saying the Rosary by yourself. Just get into your room by yourself, kneel down and say the Rosary. Then when you go to school or go out to play, talk to your Catholic friends and try to get them to get together with you. Tell them what you are doing to show your love for the Mother of God, and before you know it, the others will want to do the same thing. And then just watch how God will bless you over and over again. You love His Mother; He will love you.

Délután fél 2-kor gyülekezünk az iskola udvarán, majd négyes rendekben a Highland Ave és Lexington Ave nyugati oldalán felállunk. Saját zenekarunk vezetivel az óriási férfítömeget le a Pope Pius High School elé, ahol szentbeszéd és szentségi áldás lesz.
